Talking Points

- ➤ With respect to ancient history and in particular the treatment of the Persian civilization, the existing K-12 State education <u>standards</u> are notably <u>outdated</u> and continue to reflect one-sided accounts of Greek historians.
- This has resulted in the development of <u>textbooks</u> that <u>fail</u> to adequately and accurately cover a centrally important civilization of the ancient. To the extent that these works distort our present understanding of history, they perform a disservice to all students, and are especially <u>offensive and demeaning</u> to those California students who are of Persian heritage.
- This grave deficiency in the State standards has been <u>recognized by the</u>

 <u>California State Board of Education</u> (CSBE) which is currently collaborating with subject matter scholars to revise and bring the standards up to date.
- ➤ <u>Textbook publishers</u> (e.g., TCI the publisher of "History Alive!") have also <u>acknowledged this deficiency</u> and are taking corrective measures including providing teaching supplements and reevaluating the contents of their textbooks.
- ➤ While the relevant standards are in the process of revision, students and teachers should <u>rely on supplements</u> that present a more accurate and balanced account of ancient history.
